subcommittee aimed to address issues arising when guardians do not consent to inpatient psychiatric care despite children's imminent suicide risk. The second conducted a suicide gap analysis in Indiana. The third aimed to enhance parity compliance in Indiana. I also reviewed child and adult deaths in Indiana who

were in contact with community mental health clinics and provided

recommendations to those clinics to improve care.
